

## **Did You Know?**

With an election fast approaching and scheduled for March 4, 2008; **Did You Know** that the City of Hondo, Code of Ordinances, Article 25.1604.2, Political Signs, states:

On public right-of-way, temporary political signs shall not be attached or placed on traffic signals, utility poles, trees, and other similar vegetation. No temporary political sign shall be placed on Highway 90 Parkway (north side of Highway 90, between Highway 90 and railroad tracks) between Avenue E and Castro Avenue. Temporary political signs may be erected or maintained for a period not to exceed forty-five (45) days prior to date of the election and shall be removed within ten (10) days following such election. While no permit is required, individuals wanting to place signs on public right-of-way shall deposit fifty (50) dollars to the City Secretary. Monies deposited will be used to reimburse the City of Hondo for removal of any such signs after the ten (10) days have expired following the election.

No temporary political signs are allowed on any City property.

City employees, acting under the direction of the City Manager are authorized to remove any temporary political signs if it is determined that the provisions have not been met.
